The Vellore Mutiny of 1806 took place at the fort of Vellore in Tamil Nadu, South East India. The insurrection was sparked by the new directive from the commander in chief Sir John Craddock, issued with the approval of Lord William Bentinck, Governor of Madras, to require sepoys, the native indian soldiers, to wear a new form of turban resembling a European hat, and to shave their beards. Lord William Bentinck (1774-1839) was appointed Governor of Madras in 1803, at the early age of 29.

BOOKS FROM THE COLLECTION OF ALAN & JOAN TUCKER

Alan and Joan Tucker established their bookselling business in Stroud in 1962. It ended 55 years later with Alan's death last April.

The first shop opened on Hill Street, with a "good luck" message from Laurie Lee. When the Council needed the site for a new police station, the business moved to a small shop on Station Road, now concentrating on new books. Secondhand books were sold through catalogues, always containing an eclectic range of items at prices to suit all pockets. Over the next thirty years, Tuckers' Bookshop expanded to three other sites on the road plus the former Stationmaster's House as their main office.

Alan's passion was poetry, and he was also a prolific correspondent, especially with Morris Cox, Rigby Graham and Tom Clarke of the Moschatel Press, with all of whom he collaborated on various private press publications.
